Below is a partial list of activities that may become choices.

- Help with homework, study for tests, assist with a school-related project
- Take a walk around town, through the countryside, or on designated hiking trails
- Go fishing, take a boat ride, go swimming, canoe ride, tubing, city swimming pool
- Help a neighbor do simple yard work, clean out the garage, clean windows, errands
- Complete a woodworking project, build something, homeowner projects
- Attend the White County 4H Fair, food vendors, talent shows, educational exhibits
- Visit the city park, community center, skate parks, and other outdoor venues
- Attend a sporting event, youth leagues, school teams, college teams, pro teams
- Help out at a local church, UMC Soup for the Souls, Presbyterian Rummage Sale
- Extra-curricular events, school play, band & chorus concert, clubs and organizations
- Church activities, first communion, confirmation, vacation bible school, camp
- Cook a meal, go on a picnic, grill out, go to a nice restaurant
- Put together a jigsaw puzzle, model car or airplane, remote controlled car or drone
- Cards & board games, outdoor lawn games, corn hole, putt-putt golf, arcade center
- Visit the zoo, museum, caves, pumpkin patch, haunted house, horseback riding
- Bike ride, scooter ride, four-wheeler ride, golf cart ride, hot air balloon, zip-line
- Visit Indiana Beach, the rides, the delicious food, train ride, chair lift ride, water park
- Plant a garden, grow fruits and vegetables, plant flowers, plant a trees and bushes
- Help at the Humane Society, pet shop, the CDC, a local business, a local farmer
